

STATEMENT OF THE DIRECTRESS

INNOVATION AS A DRIVER FOR CHANGE: TOWARDS INSTITUTIONAL CONSOLIDATION

The pandemic was still in place during 2021, and its impact was felt throughout the year. Although, 2021 started with a strong feeling of hope after a year of many challenges, but also opportunities. In early 2020, when we began as a new team, the year turned out to be quite different from what we expected. Despite all obstacles, we managed to make 2020 and 2021 more than just the years of the COVID-19. Much has been done, not only concerning research activities, but also regarding internal participation and the regular activities of governance and decision-making. CICS.NOVA not only maintained its activity, but also increased it. Regarding the definition of the strategy started in 2020, the reasons of such hope were understandable due to the very interesting results, despite COVID-19 pandemic, that emerged and followed a successful path.

Today, we can say that CICS.NOVA is very different in so many ways from CICS.NOVA in the beginning of 2020. In 2021, along with 2022, we consolidated scientific recognition and success. CICS.NOVA acquired greater relevance in terms of quality, merit, and internationalization of its research activities. As the 2021 report shows, and comparing with



2020, there was an impressive increase in physical achievement indicators, namely in the number of indexed publications (SCOPUS, WoS, Scielo, PubMed) and other international data bases with impact factor. CICS.NOVA also increased the number of research projects financed with international funds. In the same line, we submitted a higher number of research proposals with a rate of success consistently above the average. There was also a pronounced internationalization of outputs, including the participation in international conferences and networks, resulting in publications that meet peer review criteria. In 2021, CICS.NOVA also reinforced its commitment to Open Science, to make scientific knowledge available to the scientific community and society in general. Open Access promotion and implementation in CICS.NOVA researchers' publications, and in CICS.NOVA Editions, is part of our commitment to the democratization of the produced knowledge.

In 2021 an impressive number of different types of meetings, open to the public and widely publicized, were organized, giving expression to the dissemination of CICS.NOVA research and its areas of scientific innovation. Teams of excellence organized short meetings and courses in their areas of expertise, and we increase the offer of Curricular Units linked to ongoing projects. Also advanced training and several kinds of activities with graduate, master, and PhD students were scheduled regularly. 2021 was also the year of consolidation for CICS.NOVA on social media. We improved our presence on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and YouTube, valuing CICS.NOVA research and activities as poles of science/society interaction and/or knowledge transfer. This was particularly critical in a year of transition between online and in-person events. Despite pandemics, CICS.NOVA extended its participation in projects of knowledge co-creation involving a diverse set of non-academic stakeholders and in projects supporting policy design. Also in 2021, CICS.NOVA researchers were involved in a diverse set of scientific outreach activities and were present at the major media channels that widely covered our work.

The high level of activity CICS.NOVA kept throughout 2021 translates the capacity of its Research Team and its S&T Management Staff that prove to be resilient, replying speedily by putting in action their problem-solving abilities. Despite pandemics, CICS.NOVA researchers were able to adapt research plans and schedules, to extend the deadlines to meet their projects objectives, placing additional work and pressure to both, research teams and CICS.NOVA's structure. The S&T management team once more prove to rise to the challenge.

But CICS.NOVA is facing already a bigger challenge: the need to respond to the call by FCT, concerning the evaluation process of the R&D Units 2023-2024. We will keep working, committed to our mission, fulfilling the strategy conceived since 2020, towards institutional consolidation, where innovation has been the driver for a new scientific program to be implemented in the very next future. The upward trajectory in terms of the quality of CICS.NOVA's achievements in 2021 is impressive. The key to all this has been the high level of commitment and engagement of its researchers and the S&T management team at all levels, individually and collectively. Above all, it is my duty as CICS.NOVA's Directress to thank all the members of our community for the job well done.

In 2021 the RG1 – Social Inequalities and Public action – had 17 integrated researchers, 5 ongoing PhD researchers with doctoral grants (4 of them with FCT funding). Regarding this last indicator, the RG1 is the 2nd most contributing RG to the CICS.NOVA Advanced Training.

During 2021 the scientific production of the RG1 can be resumed through the following quantitative indicators:

Publications

During 2021, the group published 4 papers in Scopus and/or WOS journals (3 of them in Q1 and Q2 journals); 3 papers in journals indexed on other relevant platforms (SciELO; RePEc/IDEAS; Qualis/CAPES); 2 coordinations of special issues in indexed journals (Scopus and WOS); 1 coordination of special issues in indexed journals (SciELO; RePEc/IDEAS; Qualis/CAPES); 3 national books coordinations and 2 national books with authorship or co-authorship. In total, the RG1 contributed with 23 publications in 2021.

Although the total of publications is not particularly high, we should specify that in 2021 the overwhelming majority of the RG1 integrated researchers were full time professors.



Advanced Training

Even though there was no concluded tutorship in a PhD Program associated with CICS.NOVA (there was only 1 supervised and concluded tutorship in 2021 at a PhD program not associated with CICS.NOVA), this is a very promising indicator within RG1 since we have a PhD in Gender Studies and a Master in Women's Studies (both associated with CICS.NOVA Advanced Training programs) in which several RG1 integrated researchers have ongoing supervisions. For 2022 we already estimate 3 finished PhD and 8 finished Master's theses (lower estimation), supervised by RG1 integrated researchers. Still, there were 9 concluded Master's theses supervised by RG1 integrated researchers in Advanced Training programs not associated with CICS.NOVA.



In 2021 RG2 consisted of 40 integrated researchers. This number included 2 full time contracted researchers (CEEC) and 3 PhD student grant holders (FCT grants). Our researchers' were involved in several competitive funded research projects. We highlight the coordination by RG2 researchers of 7 national and 5 international funded projects. We consider that RG2 had a significant increase in the levels of scientific production, with the publication of several articles in highly relevant scientific journals, particularly international ones. RG2 work resulted in 149 publications. We published 71 articles in peer-reviewed journals. From these we emphasize the internationalization of our research with the publication of 35 articles in Q1/Q2 international journals, 29 chapters in international books and finally the coordination of 6 international books in prestigious academic publishing houses.

In 2021, RG3 researchers ran 16 grants from competitive funding calls, 8 funded PhD projects and 10 projects commissioned by civil society institutions. The projects' research themes include climate change, maritime issues, tourism and urban research.

The main indicators show an improving publication track record. In 2021, researchers have authored 24 papers in Scopus and/or WOS journals (17 of them in Q1 & Q2 journals); 10 papers in other journals; 16 chapters in books from international publishers, including Routledge, Palgrave, and Springer; and 9 book chapters and 2 books from recognized Portuguese publishers. In particular, no-fishing areas and raising awareness about sustainable practices were recommended by those with higher self-perceived influence. Such information on target groups and factors to promote is essential for facilitating empowerment towards conservation and laying robust foundations for resource comanagement, especially given the role communities can play in the face of limited state capacity and enforcement.

This article proposes a metaphorical approach to the meaning-making of Portuguese assisted reproductive technology beneficiaries about human embryos created in vitro, based on interviews. Four metaphors were identified in patients' utterances about the embryo's status and attributes: embryos are possibilities of success of treatment; utilities that can be the object of ownership and dispositional control; potential offspring with whom there are family and emotional ties; and a counter-gift to science or other beneficiaries, in response to the generosity of professionals or gamete donors. These rhetorical devices seem to ease the tensions inherent in the technical procedures of medically assisted reproduction. Examining the meaning of attributive metaphors used by patients undergoing in-vitro fertilization about their embryos in vitro is essential to understanding their experiences, so that healthcare professionals can direct their actions/interventions towards their needs and concerns.

CONTINUITY THROUGH CHANGE: STATE SOCIAL RESEARCH AND SOCIOLOGY IN PORTUGAL

This article examines the development of empirical social research in Portugal over about a century and its relation to the early institutionalization of sociology. Coupling new empirical data with a critical reading of the main sources on the topic, it brings to light epistemic invariants in a disparate body of research, acknowledging the initial persistence of Le Play-inspired as well as properly Le Playsian research methods. It also identifies the continuing concern with the (physical and then moral) condition of rural and industrial workers, leading to a disclosure of the political-economic and governmental roots of the social research in question. From a historical sociology perspective, the article explores the relation between state governmentalization and authoritarian rule, and the development of the social sciences. From a history of science perspective, it acknowledges the continuous use of the same methods to carry out seemingly incommensurable social research programmes and the later pursuit of a properly sociological research programme that fell back on conflicting methodological and theoretical approaches. The article puts forward a historical sociology of theoretical approaches, research methods, and scientific concepts, contributing to a clearer understanding of their respective fields of application.







The journal has been indexed in Latindex since 2016.





Issue 45|2021 highlighted the life and work of the Portuguese scientist Odette Ferreira and presented distinct original works, theoretical and empirical.

The journal is indexed in SciELO Portugal, Qualis-Capes/Brazil, Latindex, MIAR, ERIH PLUS and EIGE – Eurogender. During 2021 its Editorial Board prepared its application to Scopus index platform, one of the most prestigious index platforms of scientific work, as part of CICS.NOVA and Universidade NOVA de Lisboa efforts to improve the index quality and ratings of its editorial seal journals. In January 2021 the journal was accepted to join SciELO Portugal open access indexing platform and in October 2021 it submitted its application to DOAJ, receiving a positive evaluation in January 2022 by improving and clarifying its publication practices accordingly to COPE's recommendations. In November 2021 the journal also submitted its application to the Scopus index platform, nonetheless, it received a temporary unfavourable evaluation in December 2021. Since then, its Editorial Board is working to improve its editorial strategy, according to the comments of the Scopus Content Selection & Advisory Board (CSAB).



CICS.NOVA in 2021 continued to adopt Creative Commons Licences, DOI and ORCID author identifiers for most journals under its responsibility, to promote transparency and accuracy and eliminate, thus, ambiguity in copyright, digital objects and authorship. Furthermore, most of its journals started to digitally preserve the full digital version of their issues in one of the institutional repositories of RCAAP, the Open Access Scientific Repositories of Portugal.

BOOK COLLECTIONS

Coleção Diagnósticos & Perspectivas

(CICS.NOVA/Húmus) is a recent and fully open access book collection in the Social Sciences, mainly without publication fees for authors, which edits its books in print and digital formats and follows an editorial policy of service to the scientific community and culture. All books published are submitted to a scientific peer-reviewed process, given a DOI identifier and an ISBN number and immediately made available for readers in the institutional repository of Universidade NOVA de Lisboa – RUN.


Throughout 2021 the collection published 1 volume: *Digital labours platforms: Representing workers in Europe*, edited by António Brandão Moniz, Nuno Boavida, Csabo Makó, Bettina-Johanna Krings and Pablo Sanz de Miguel. A work that analysed the heterogeneous typology of workers in digital platforms, as well as their strategies to improve their work and how they promote collective organizations in several European countries. Moreover, it emerges from a larger research project entitled *Crowd-work: Finding new strategies to organize in Europe*, funded by the European Commission.



Coleção Debater o Social (CICS.NOVA/Húmus) is a book collection with more than 50 volumes, published in print and digital formats, and edited by our hub at Universidade do Minho. Most of these publications were fully or partially funded by FCT through the CICS.NOVA project or by funds from FCT/H2020 projects. It encompasses diverse works resulting from doctoral theses, research results and works on various topics in the Social Sciences.



In 2021 2 new books were published: *Desigualdades sociais e grupos sociais vulneráveis: Sociedade, políticas e estratégias de sobrevivência em Cabeceiras de Basto e Celorico de Basto* (No. 56), by Helena M. Carvalho, which deepen the sociological knowledge about social inequalities among vulnerable social groups in Cabeceiras de Basto and Celorico de Basto,

Portugal; and *Envelhecimento, género e sexualidades* (No. 55), coordinated by Sara I. Magalhães and Conceição Nogueira, which analyses the experiences and subjectivities of people designated as “old people”.



CICS.NOVA e-book collection is a peer-reviewed digital edition currently being restructured. Its Editorial Board aims for the collection to become a driving agent of dissemination and communication of scientific knowledge in face of a fasting and growing global context of information diffusion. All volumes published within the collection encompass social themes, not exclusively restricted to the national context, and are given a Creative Commons License, DOI identifier and an ISBN number. Research works methodologically grounded in interdisciplinary approaches are also welcomed within.


During 2021 the collection published 2 works: *Arte e ecologia humana*, coordinated by Larissa Maly and Iva Pires, a work that seeks to reflect the intrinsic relationship between art and human ecology approaching different creative processes in formal and non-formal spaces of education and artistic production; *Ana Firmino: Um olhar singular sobre o espaço rural*; *Textos Reunidos (1988-2020)*, coordinated by Cecília Delgado, Dulce Pimentel and Francesca Poggi, a work which gathers several texts of Ana Firmino, from 1984 to 2020, aiming to honour the scientific career of the Portuguese researcher.



WORKING PAPERS

ComTextos is a digital collection of working papers edited by our hub located at Universidade do Minho and fully available for all readers. Originally intended for CICS.NOVA researchers with ongoing scientific work, its Editorial Board aims to promote scientific discussion and the pursuit of future project proposals and started to work together with CICS.NOVA to find strategies for the dissemination and expansion of the collection to other scientific and academic forums institutionally plural.

In 2021 the collection published 1 working paper: *Colaboração entre as associações de professores no design curricular das Aprendizagens Essenciais em Portugal*, by Sílvia de Almeida, Joana Viana, Natália Barcelos, Maria do Céu Roldão and Helena Peralta, a work which intended to understand the dynamics of the curriculum design of the guiding documents *Aprendizagens Essenciais* by teacher associations in Portugal.



SCIENCE MANAGEMENT

CICS.NOVA is supported by the collaboration of 6 Science and Technology Managers, distributed by the institutional partners (Universidade NOVA de Lisboa, Universidade dos Açores, Universidade do Minho, Instituto Politécnico de Leiria, and Universidade de Évora), that generates support for scientific research.



The science management team collaborates in the administrative and financial management of the research unit; in the pre-award research administration (finding funding; budget creation; filling out proposal forms; submitting the proposal; etc.); in the post-award research administration (project managing; financial compliance monitoring; monitoring, reporting; and billing); in editions management; and in science communication activities.




SCIENCE IN SOCIETY

KNOWLEDGE CO-CREATION AND KNOWLEDGE4POLICY

The joint production of knowledge between our researchers and the industry, governmental and non-governmental organisations has been a pillar of CICS.NOVA's activities from its foundation. Such activities are, many times, articulated with the development of a comprehensive set of tools to inform public policy. In 2021, this continued to be the case with all research groups actively participating in knowledge co-creation and knowledge for policy efforts raising to a total of 29 financed projects in areas as diverse as domestic violence, substance abuse, environment, crime and education, among many others. The project “**JOVITEMPREGO - Trajetórias de desemprego, vivências e percursos de vida dos jovens na ilha de São Miguel**” aims to study and define intervention strategies to address the impacts of unemployment on the life trajectories of the Azorean youth. This project is a partnership between CICS.NOVA, Fundação Gaspar Frutuoso and the Universidade dos Açores. It is financed by the Direção Regional da Ciência e Tecnologia (Açores).

The project “**A-Place**” is a co-creation project aiming to strengthen the bonds between people and places through the

development of site-specific art, creative spatial practises and cultural projects. It is financed by the Creative Europe programme of the European Commission and involves multiple stakeholders including universities, civil society associations, municipalities, among others.

The project “**VITIPOLIS - A Segurança na Cidade de Lisboa**” aims to develop proposals to improve the Community Policing program in Lisboa and to contribute for the development of public policies tools of crime prevention and policing models promoting participatory citizenship. 
